


5th to 6th Grade... A Time of Transition

How is middle school different?

- Different Classes
 - You will go to a different classroom for each subject.
 - You'll need to learn where each class is and what time it starts.
- New Rules
 - It's your responsibility to become familiar with the school rules.
 - Read the student handbook for this information when it is issued at the beginning of the year with your family.
- A Busier Schedule
 - You will have 3 minutes to get from one class to the next.
 - You will have a locker to keep your books, coat, etc. practice using your lock!
- More Classmates /Bigger School
 - There may be different students in every class you have.
 - Be respectful and polite to everyone around you.



How is middle school different?

- More Teachers/Teams
 - You will be on a team.
 - You will have a different teacher for every class.
 - Become familiar with each teacher's classroom rules and expectations.
- More Choices
 - You will have opportunities to participate in a variety of extracurricular activities.
- More Homework
 - This is another part of your growing responsibility.



1. Be Present & Involved

>Attendance is key to success in school


>Be **on-time** to school – school starts at 8:01 (students should arrive at 7:55 to have time to go to their lockers and get organized for the day)

>Be **involved** in learning – participation in class is an important factor in learning.

>Attend **extra help** - it provides opportunities for clarification of new concepts, time to ask questions, individualized time with your teacher, and time to review information learned.




- 2. Home-School Partnership
 - It is crucial to partner with your counselor, your team teachers, Vice-Principal, Principal and other school personnel.
 - > Be pro-active
 - Communicate with teachers/team meetings can be arranged
 - Use website to check for homework, events, parent conferences
 - Parent Portal
 - Join PTA-Read Email Blasts



3. Organization

- > A home routine is critical!!!
 - > A time/place to study & do homework
 - > A designated place to keep backpack and school items
 - Practice the morning routine in the summer to make sure your child allows the time he/she needs to get ready and be ontime.
- Develop time management skills
- Use agenda book to track homework and assignments
- Be prepared for school and classes...homework, assignments, projects, gym clothes, musical instrument




Your school counselor is your advocate!

Your counselor will help:


- Ease the transition

10 ways to get involved in your child's education

- 1. Talk with your child every day about his or her school experiences, successes, and worries.
- 2. Read the school handbook and all notices that the school sends home.
- 3. Meet your child's teacher and attend parent-teacher conferences.
- 4. Consult your child's teacher or school staff whenever you have concerns.
- 5. Attend open houses, school events, programs for parents, and school-board meetings.





10 ways to get involved in your child's education

- 6. Stay aware of your child's academic progress. Praise all earnest efforts and accomplishments.
- 7. Review homework assignments each day and help your child organize time and work.
- 8. Provide learning experiences. Visit museums, watch educational TV shows, and have books and other learning materials available at home.



10 ways to get involved in your child's education

- 9. Join the school's PTA and participate in its activities.
- 10. Volunteer at school; there are many opportunities to offer your services with.

Remember -your attention and involvement shows your child that school is important!
