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Board of Education Comments (continued)

- Vice President Vrona asked why the budget increase is 1.76% and the tax levy is 1.92% (base for budget is \$140mil base for tax levy is \$100mil); e-rate ½ back during fiscal year (unknown); maker spaces vs. computer labs (East & West have rooms with labs while Lindell and Lido have stand-alone rooms; asked about new access points (all new); are cheer team members also cheerleaders (no).
- President Ryan asked if there is any way to better project increase in benefits costs (no NYSHIP quoted 10% and it was only 3.5%); asked about status of robotics and technology budget; keeping Saturday morning program (67 students – district cost is very small); suggested cursive writing as a course; asked about JV hockey team and uniforms, cheerleading at MS; Ms. Posterli requested budget stay under 2% and wants A/C fund.
- Mrs. Vrona asked about 25% increase in flood insurance (LB is unique); are new permanent subs in budget (yes); increase in NIKE clerical (replacement has higher salary; questioned code shift in TAs and what non-special education TAs do (clericals, computer labs, Read 180, dean's office); happy that textbook expenses went down but teaching supplies and tests for IB increased (due to increase in student participation); maker spacer increase, transfer to capital for transportation (handicap bus); food service subsidy (reduced); budget enough for cyber insurance (yes).
